

**ENGLISH 520, Fall Term 2019**  
**“Community Engagement through Literature”**  
**Instructor: Dr. Susan Bennett (sbennett@ucalgary.ca)**

This course will combine classroom and community-based learning in partnership with the Calgary Public Library’s “Creative Writing Club.” The goals of “Community Engagement through Literature” are to explore practical ways that knowledge gained in the study of English might serve the community and to reflect on the relationship between literary studies and public service.

Students will meet in a formal classroom setting to examine and discuss assigned readings on service learning and community engagement. Once a week students, in teams of two, will work in a community partner setting (one of eight library branches), bringing their expertise and interest in literature to help students in grades 5-9 improve their writing skills. In this role, you will be encouraged to actively test possible approaches to engaging younger students with creative writing through a wide range of activities of your choice/design. University volunteers are also expected to be positive mentors and role models. Students in ENGL 520 have the opportunity to shape how the “Creative Writing Club” works and to offer valuable feedback to the Library on the program’s strengths and challenges.

Course assignments will include regular critical reflections, a review paper based on assigned literature and volunteer experiences, and a final oral report offering a critical assessment of the “Creative Writing Club” activities.

Successful applicants will be asked to complete the Calgary Public Library’s police background check (no cost involved to the student).

The class will meet on campus from 3:30-4:45 most Mondays, starting on September 9; the day and time of the library volunteer session will depend on location (students will need to allow for travel time to/from library branch so as to arrive promptly). Orientation at the assigned library branch will be in the week of September 9, with volunteer sessions starting the following week. We will also have one class (September 16) at the downtown Calgary Public Library where staff member Kate Schutz will run an ideation workshop.

Please note that volunteer sessions will run through the week of December 9 (i.e. during the University exam period) and students are expected to fulfill this obligation in lieu of a final exam in the course.
