Please note that, in the required text list, a number offer a choice of two texts. Make your choices carefully, as the exam papers will require historical, regional and generic breadth. You may focus on certain authors, regions, genres or theorists further in your own module. There is also a list of recommended and reference texts that provides a) selected general and introductory overviews to the field and b) a short list of readers and anthologies from which you can select many of the shorter literary texts in this list. Others can often be found through online or full-text library resources.
