

- <u>Thalamus</u> is pivotal in tinnitus-related activity in both animals and humans.
- ALFF connectivity is consistent with that based on correlated SFRs and gamma.
- SFRs in auditory cortex are driven from outside the ascending auditory pathway.
- The prefrontal cortex is ideally situated for gating thalamo-cortical output.

## **Primals Project -Penn's Positive Psychology Center Announcement**

The Primals Project at Penn's Positive Psychology Center is delighted to announce the **Primals Research Student Awards** for PhD students and postdoc trainees only. Grants of up to \$20,000 will be awarded for the empirical study of primals—also called "primal world beliefs." Primals are basic perceptions of the world's general character. A foundational taxonomic effort recently identified 26 hierarchically arranged primals that are stable over time and orthogonal to most demographics, yet strongly correlated to behavior and wellbeing (<u>Clifton et al., 2019</u>). Most variation is explained by three higher-order primals: the beliefs the world is *Safe* (vs. dangerous), *Enticing* (vs. dull), and *Alive* (vs. mechanistic). These awards are intended to encourage original research into the origins and psychological impact of any of the 26 primals. **2-page submissions due May 27, 2022** (<u>details online</u>).

The journal welcomes submissions from Canadian graduate and undergraduate students for our August 2022 edition. We encourage scholars from an array of disciplines to submit their work for publication and welcome work from several disciplines, including: history, political science, anthropology, and many others.

The CGJSC welcomes publications that make an original empirical, theoretical, or artistic/creative contributions to the fields of sociology, criminology, and other related disciplines. This journal accepts submissions employing quantitative, qualitative, and mixed research methodologies. We encourage submissions from a broad range of theoretical approaches and place special emphasis on interdisciplinary engagement, critical analysis, and innovative scholarship. In line with this mission, we also invite alternative and non-traditional submissions that extend beyond academic articles, such as: visual and textual media, critical commentaries, policy briefs, reflective essays/position papers, book or film reviews, poems, comics, short stories, and photographic essays.

Our deadline for submissions is 11:59 PM EST on July 1, 2022.
