

- <u>Thalamus</u> is pivotal in tinnitus-related activity in both animals and humans.
- ALFF connectivity is consistent with that based on correlated SFRs and gamma.
- SFRs in auditory cortex are driven from outside the ascending auditory pathway.
- The prefrontal cortex is ideally situated for gating thalamo-cortical output.



Position Overview

The Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) Institute of Neurosciences, Mental Health and Addiction (INMHA) in the Cumming School of Medicine invites applications for an Associate Lead, Mental Health Services. This Full-time Fixed Term position is for approximately 12 months (based on length of grant funding), with the possibility of extension for up to an additional 2 years.

The CIHR-INMHA, headquartered at the University of Calgary, is one of the thirteen virtual institutes of CIHR. CIHR-INMHA has a mandate to support research that enhances knowledge of the brain, mental health, neurological health, vision, hearing and cognitive functioning and to reduce the burden of related disorders through prevention strategies, screening, diagnosis, treatment, support systems, and palliation.

Must be able to work flexiible hours. Some travel may be required.

The CIHR-INMHA Associate Lead, Mental Health Services reports to the Scientific Director (SD) with functional reporting to the Associate Scientific Director (ASD) and the Assistant Director (AD).

The Associate Lead, Mental Health Services on will work closely with the AD, Team Lead, Health Services Research and Implementation Science and other team members. The incumbent will also work collaboratively with the CIHR Initiative Management and Institute Support branch, other branches and departments of CIHR as well as government partners, as required.

The Associate Lead, Mental Health Services will support and coordinate a number of strategic institute projects, initiatives and funding opportunities in the area of mental health services research with a particular emphasis on youth mental health, post-traumatic stress, and virtual care. Some of the responsibilities will include organizing meetings and events, drafting and preparing materials, coordinating the development of funding opportunities and providing operational and administrative support to assigned projects.

The University of New Brunswick in Saint John, as part of their Integrated Health Initiative, invites applications for a tenure-track position in Health at the rank of Assistant Professor, commencing July 1, 2022, or a mutually acceptable date thereafter.

The Integrated Health Initiative (IHI) focuses on health education and research; social innovation; and interdisciplinary collaboration and includes a newly developed Bachelor of Health program. In addition to interdisciplinary courses in topics relevant to health, the program includes three majors: Biomedical Sciences and Health; Society and Health; and Management in Health. Assistant Professor - Indiginous Studies (UNB)

The University of New Brunswick in Saint John, as part of their Integrated Health Initiative, invites applications for a tenure-track position in Indigenous Health at the rank of Assistant Professor, commencing July 1, 2022 or a mutually acceptable date thereafter.

The successful candidate will teach undergraduate courses in the Bachelor of Health, such as: Indigenous Health Determinants; Health from a Global Perspective; and Transformation through Collaboration and Innovation. Candidates will also develop courses in their area of expertise within the biomedical sciences, social sciences, business/management, or the humanities that focus on the health of individuals, populations, and communities. The supervision of undergraduate research (e.g., Honours theses) is required. Opportunities to participate in relevant graduate programs, including the supervision and teaching of graduate students, is expected.

This position is for an Indigenous scholar. Candidates must have minimum of a Masters degree in Health or a related area; a PhD is preferred. Candidates will be expected to have expertise or experience in Indigenous health determinants. Applicants from cognate fields with the required expertise or experience in Indigenous health determinants will also be considered for this position. This position will uphold UNB's commitment to increasing the representation of Indigenous individuals and thus, preference will be given to Indigenous applicants.

Post Doc Fellowship:

The Depression Cognition and Culture (DCC) Lab (PI: Dr. Shadi Beshai) at the University of Regina is reviewing applications for a one-year Postdoctoral Fellowship, for start in July 2022. We are looking for a research-motivated Doctoral student in psychology (or related discipline) nearing the end of their degree, or a postdoc who is enthusiastic about research and wishes to continue toward an academic path.

The successful candidate is expected to assist in a) preparing manuscripts for peer-review; b) writing or compiling tri-agency (national) grant applications; c) designing and shepherding large online trials; d) completing diagnostic interviewing and other clinical assessments where needed; and e) cleaning and analyzing data.

The ideal candidate should have evidence of scholarly success in the form of publications in reputable peer-reviewed outlets, evidence of securing funding (or scholarship success), and experience with SPSS or other major data analytic software (Mplus; R; Stata; etc.). The ideal candidate is highly organized, self-driven, can work autonomously, and has experience designing experiments on Qualtrics. Knowledge of or willingness to learn longitudinal data analyses, crosscultural approaches to psychopathology, and/or mindfulness-based interventions are definite assets.
